Approvals for Childcare Facilities Regulated by the Ohio Department of Education

During 1991, Ohio law pertaining to childcare in schools changed to require licensure of these facilities by the Ohio Department of Education (ODE). The process for licensure has several implications for building officials.

Since the type of the facility determines whether not building department orinvolvement would be required, the attached form: BUILDING SAFETY INSPECTION was revised (see attached Form ECEL 3.0) to boththe applicant and department distinguish the type of facility as well indicating the conditions limitations of the building approval to the Ohio Department of Education (ODE).

Existing Pre-school and School-age Childcare in Existing School Buildings & New Schoolage Childcare in Existing School Buildings

The Law (OPC 55104 011) states that are

The Law (ORC \$5104.011) states that an inspection is not necessary when the child care is for school-aged children and that type facility is to be located in an existing school. For existing pre-school and schoolage childcare in existing school buildings and new school-age childcare in existing school buildings school buildings, the applicant will complete Part I of the form and no building department involvement would be required. However, for the other types of facilities, at least some level of building department involvement will be necessary and Part II of the form will have to be completed.

Existing Pre-school and School-age Childcare in Existing Non-school Buildings

For programs currently operating, or for new programs intending to open where similar childcare existed in non-school buildings, evidence must be provided to indicate that the facility was approved for such use. If there is a Certificate of Use and Occupancy on file with the applicant or at the building department indicating such use, attach a copy, then complete Part II of the form (inspections would not be applicable).

Ιf Certificate the of tJse and Occupancy is not available, the applicant would proceed by having the building owner request a Certificate of Use and Occupancy for the existing building (as provided in OAC §4101:2-1-27{D}). Assuming there are no outstanding orders on the building, use has existed, and, after inspection, the facility is found to be without serious hazards, a Certificate can be issued and Part II of the form completed. The inspection performed would be indicated on the form as "safe & sanitary".

New Preschool-age Childcare Facilities in Existing Schools or Churches

New E Use Group facilities in existing schools (and churches, see OBBC §304.1.1 note), would not impose the "change of use" requirements. However, those requirements specifically related to child day care (e.g., plumbing facilities) would have to be in place and a determination made by the building official that the building is free of serious hazards. In this case, the owner should also request an updated Certificate of Use and Occupancy (see preceding paragraph).

New Facilities in New Buildings, Alterations or Change of Use in Existing Buildings

Follow the normal submittal approval procedures under the OBBC. Part II \mathbf{of} the form should be completed with \mathbf{a} copy of Certificate of Use and Occupancy attached.
